Consequent upon allotment of Rice for the month of **February 2016** vide above referred to communication, sanction is hereby accorded to the allocation of **276967.42 Qtls** of Rice under (Normal Quota) in favour of **Assistant Director Stores CA&PD Kashmir Division** for the month of **February 2016**.

Sanction is, also, accorded to the allocation/ release of **276967.42 Qtls** of Rice under **normal Quota** in favour of Assistant Directors of Kashmir Division as per Annexure "A" to this order on the following rates.



Sanction is also accorded to the advance lifting of **2802.57 Qtls** of normal Rice for the month of March 2016.

The concerned Assistant Directors shall lift the entire quantity by or before 31.01.2016 and ensure its dispatchment to the respective sale outlets as per annexure "A" to this order.

The above allocation is subject to the fulfillment of following terms and conditions that:-

1. The closing Balance if any as on 31.01.2016 at sale outlets and Godowns shall be accounted for as availability for the month of February 2016.
2. The allocated quantity is lifted from the specified loading point by or before the stipulated time frame.
3. No Diversion/ re-appropriation from one scheme to another one category to another is allowed and the ration is issued only to the bonafide rationees after proper identification and on cash payment.
4. The Assistant Directors shall draw advance centre-wise roster/requirement of different commodities as per the format in vogue and shall submit a copy of the same to this Directorate for prior approval, before issuance of ration among the consumers.
5. The Assistant Directors shall be personally responsible for proper distribution of ration amongst the bonafide consumers as per the valid ration tickets/authenticated lists and shall also maintain the scale.





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- The Assistant Directors shall keep strict vigil against pilferage and overcharging at the sale outlets.
7. The Assistant Directors shall furnish the information regarding daily lifting and dispatches of foodgrains to the Directorate on the following day without any fail.
 8. The sale records shall be deposited in the respective piece checking section for inspection and records by 5th of the following month after conduct of sale of the foodgrains.
 9. The sale proceeds shall be deposited as per the norms/procedure in vogue after completion of the distribution of foodgrains by 5th of the following month positively.
 10. The un-lifted quantity, if any, owing to failure by any District, shall be correspondingly deducted from the next month's allocation and the un-lifted quantity shall not be re-allotted during the next month.
 11. The entire quantity for a particular centre out of the above allocation due for the month, shall be dumped in one go, against the pre-scheduled roaster in a water-shed form.
 12. The under-scaling of rations if any, shall be treated as misappropriation and embezzlement.
 13. The storekeeper shall obtain valid proof of identity from the fresh rationee commensurate with the authenticated list.
 14. The existing BPL/AAY should remain unchanged till a fresh verification is made in this behalf.
 15. The storekeeper shall deposit the sale records signed by village Heads/Mohalla Heads duly countersigned by TSO concerned.
 16. Two recent passport size photographs be obtained from each beneficiary, one photograph should be pasted on the sale acquaintance register (as per proforma enclosed) and another at note book /RT as the case may be of the fresh rationee and obtain signature of the rationee on the sale acquaintance register before issuance of monthly ration.
 17. The TSO/Storekeeper should identify the bogus / double entries if any and forward the same to concerned for further course of action.
 18. Existence of fresh rationee should be obtained as to whether derived from which existing ration card or otherwise.
 19. A separate physical/financial account should be maintained for the additional families
 20. The ADs shall ensure implementation of the above terms and conditions in letter and spirit. Deviation, if any, shall attract disciplinary action against the erring officer.


